The fisheries technician will be assisting with several multi-species population studies in reservoirs across the Midwest. The technician will be responsible for assisting and leading fieldwork sampling fishes using several traditional gear types. Sampling may take place from shore or by boat. Laboratory work may be required and may include organizing and recording data from water samples, biological samples, and archived spreadsheets. The technician may also be asked to assist with additional ongoing projects and to generate data for annual reports. Knowledge of basic fisheries science and basic computer skills will be beneficial to the candidate but are not required. All that is required is enthusiasm, a sense of safety, and an ability to work as a team. Technicians will learn how and why fisheries data are collected to inform management. Attention to detail, strong organizational skills, and excellent verbal and written communication skills are strongly preferred. Weekend/holiday and non-traditional work hours may be required to meet project goals.
